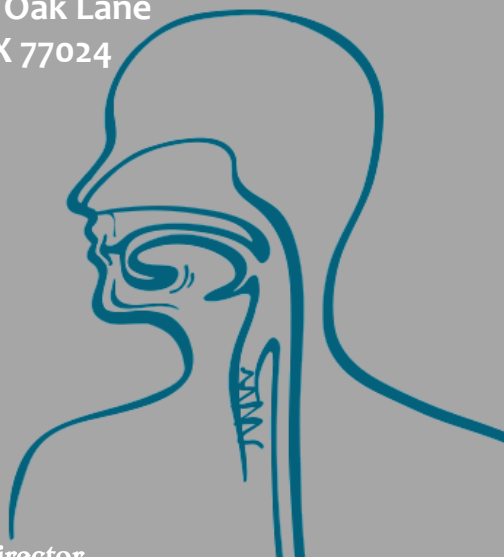

PROGRAM

Learning Objectives:

At the conclusion of the activity, the participant should be able to:

- Identify mucosal lesions and recognize their association to systemic disease;
- Utilize immunohistochemistry in the diagnosis of sinonasal tumors;
- Define which biomarkers are currently clinically needed for patient care in head and neck and salivary tumors;
- Explain and apply current CAP guidelines for HPV testing in oropharyngeal carcinomas;
- Define the spectrum and current diagnostic terms for follicular patterned thyroid entities;
- Delineate an approach to differentiate and classify adrenal tumors for improved diagnosis; and
- Recognize evolving genetic factors that contribute to paragangliomas.

Needs Assessment: In the last few years, rapid changes in the fields of head and neck and endocrine pathology have emerged. Keeping current is challenging and this symposium is designed to provide practicing pathologists current knowledge on up to date terminology in thyroid, salivary and sinonasal tumors; morphologic features and tools for differentiating head and neck tumors; delineate testing guidelines for HPV in the head and neck; and provide insight into the genetics and hereditary nature of subsets of these tumors. The lectures aim to bridge these practice areas for enhanced diagnosis and communication for quality patient care.

Target Audience: This activity is designed for physicians, educators, fellows and residents, physicians assistants, and any other health care professionals.

Educational Methods: The program format will consist of didactic lectures with Q&A and discussions. Handouts will be provided.

Evaluation: Evaluation by questionnaire will address program content, presentation, and possible bias.
